Since 1964, UMAIE has offered unique opportunities for cross-cultural study during January Term and starting in 2005, May/June Term. UMAIE, a consortium of colleges and universities, cooperates to provide the educational depth and resources necessary for an intercultural curriculum. This year UMAIE offers courses in many locations around the world including: **Africa, The Americas (North), Europe (Western, Central, Eastern and Southern), India and Turkey.** The comprehensive fee includes round-trip air transportation from Minneapolis-St. Paul to the course location; airport transfers; visas (where required for U.S. citizens who meet the visa application deadline and have the correct accompanying documentation); transportation to most course activities while abroad; lodging, primarily in twin or triple rooms in hotels (or where indicated - pensions, university dormitories, or family homes); continental breakfast daily (exceptions noted on individual course descriptions) and other meals as indicated; tickets for required theatrical and cultural performances; planned excursions; and administrative costs (however, individual institutions may assess additional charges). All rail passes, entrances and local airfares are based on utilization of youth rates (25 years or under) where possible and any participants who do not qualify for such discounts are responsible for all supplemental costs.

**REGISTRATION** — Applications are processed between **April 16th and October 4th, 2010. EARLY REGISTRATION IS ADVISED**, as all courses have enrollment limits and may fill early. <b>T3706 EDUCATION AND HEALTH CARE SYSTEMS IN TANZANIA</b>	<b>\$5395 - \$5695</b>
<i>Sheryl Feinstein and Julie Ashworth, Augustana College</i> <i>Kilimanjaro, Moshi, Iringa, Zanzibar, Dar es Salaam</i> This course explores the education and health systems in Tanzania's cities, towns, and villages, giving students an up close and personal understanding of life in a developing country.

<i>Adil Ozdemir and Amy Muse, University of St. Thomas</i> <i>Istanbul, Mardin, Urfa, Gaziantep, Adana, Cappadocia, Konya, Pamukkale, Izmir, Bursa</i> While traveling across Turkey, visiting sites essential to the development of Islam, sharing meals and conversations with Turkish Muslims, and reading about Islam from both insiders' and outsiders' perspectives, we become familiar with the basic beliefs and practices of Islam and its influence in Turkey including worship, family life, politics, modernity, gender relations, relations with other faiths, and intellectual and artistic traditions.	
<b>T3715 RELIGIONS AND CULTURES OF INDIA</b>	<b>\$5,295 - 5,595</b>
<i>Edward Ulrich and Elizabeth Harry, University of St. Thomas</i> <i>Cochin, Kottayam, Thekkady, Periyakulam, Madurai, Kumbakonam, Mahabalipuram</i> We will explore the religious diversity of India, focusing on Hinduism, Islam, and Eastern Christianity. In addition to site tours and lectures we will learn these religions through contact with the people themselves; sharing aspects of their culture and staying in homes for six nights.

<i>Mladen Turk and Lynn Hill, Elmhurst College</i> <i>Chennai, Madurai, Mamallapuram, Aurangabad, Delhi</i> "The Religions and Peoples of India" is a stunning introduction to the religions, beauty, diversity, history and challenges of the world's largest democracy.
